#### **Community Healing and Community Education**

Dear community members. The five-year Healing Fund project has finished the first 18 months and has been able to use the \$610,000 provided by the Anglican Church of Canada at a rate equal to that timeline. At this rate we will be able to complete the healing goals as requested by the Japanese Canadian community from our outreach efforts conducted from 2015 to the present.

The Healing Fund for Japanese Canadians operates three areas for healing support.

- We can cover the cost of counselling up to \$200 per session for survivors of Mr. Nakayama's sexual abuse and to their families.
- We provide post-secondary education grants to family members of survivors, retroactive to June 15, 2015.
- We can fund community healing or education programming, including any project that relates to the sexual abuse history of Mr. Nakayama or to the effects of this widespread abuse. Funded programs have included healing circles, book clubs, and writing projects.

We are responding to all community requests as they come in. The goal of the Healing Fund is to reach as many affected families of Mr. Nayama's six decades of abuse as possible and let them choose whether to engage with the Healing Fund. To help share information about the Healing Fund, community organizations across the country have been accepting information pamphlets for local distribution. We know that many families who we would like to contact do not read Japanese Canadian publications. But they might visit a cultural centre or internment camp site. Thank you to the first 31 organizations who have accepted the pamphlets!

#### Have Your Voice Heard

As a reminder, affected individuals, families, and communities have the option to provide feedback to the Healing Fund. We will be accepting responses until September, 2023, and compiling responses at that time. These responses will form the basis for evaluating the community need for the Healing Fund's programming between 2023 and 2026. You can find this feedback from on the homepage of our website, or by following this QR code.

Alternatively, you may mail in your thoughts about how you, your family, and the community can be helped to move forward from the legacy of Mr. Nakayama's sexual abuse by writing to:
